I have witnessed Ms. Cox take to the culture here like a fish to water while maintaining multiple programs provided by the LGBTQA SRC. However, as Ms. Cox has proven in her life's work, she does not accept mediocrity. She has revamped stagnant programs to include modern complements to historical content and improved them to emphasize inclusiveness. While consistently leading workshops, facilitating discussion groups, and reaching out to other organizations, Natasha Cox has steadily introduced a line of progressive programs that have conquered unfamiliar grounds at this university.

As a queer African-American woman under the age of 30, she has many accomplishments. She is intelligent, graceful and ambitious. She has reached the peak of many milestones and continues to move forward to the top. Ms. Cox works three times harder than everyone else in the center, and she even works overtime, unpaid to make sure everything that needs to be done, gets done. Her work ethic is superb and cannot be touched.
